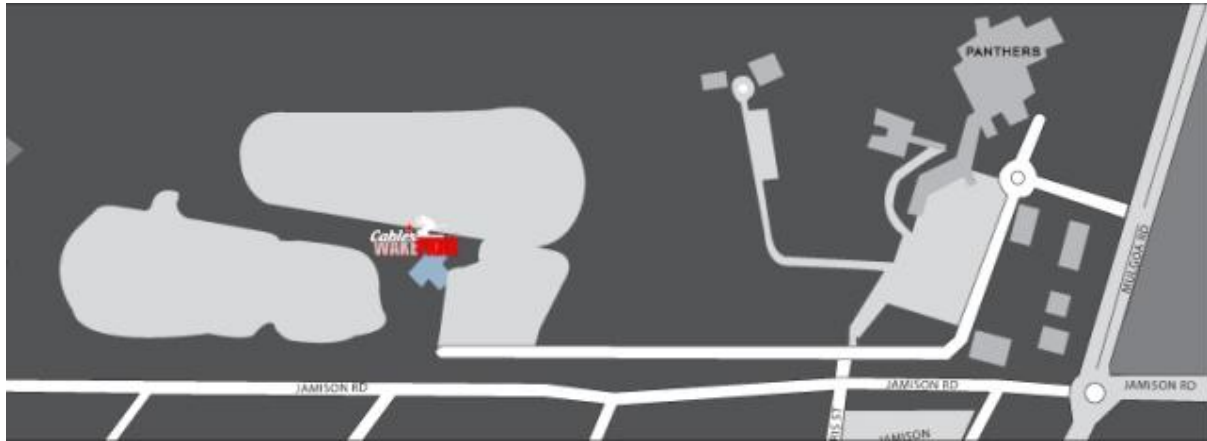

1. LOCATION

1.1 Cables Wake Park Penrith - Australia

2. HOW TO GET TO PENRITH

2.1 Train

Take train from airport to central. Then “express” from central to Penrith (via the Blue Mountains Line. Labelled “Inter-city” - these trains are painted blue on the front.

Directions: Go to Airport Domestic or Airport International Train Station.

At either of these stations go to platform 1.

Catch the train to Central station and change to platform 14 or 15 – the Blue Mountains Line express to Penrith (please enquire at service desk if need be).

Travel time is approximately 1 hour.

THIS ROUTE HAS TOLLS

1. Head south on **Departure Plaza** towards **Cook River Ave** 400m
2. Continue onto **Cooks River Ave** 170m
3. Take the ramp onto **Marsh St** 1.2km
4. turn right to merge onto **M5 East Freeway** 6.9km
5. Continue onto **South Western Motorway** (signs for **Liverpool/Canberra**) 18.5km
6. Take the exit onto **Westlink M7/M7** towards **Blacktown/Newcastle** 19.5km
7. Take the exit towards **Metroad M4/ Penrith/Blacktown/Sydney** 400m
8. Keep left at the fork, follow signs for **Penrith/BLUE MOUNTAINS** and merge onto **Western Motorway** 17.3km
9. Take the **Mulgoa Road** exit towards **Penrith/Wallacia//Richmond** 450m
10. Turn right at **MULGOA Rd** 850m
11. Turn left at **Panthers Leagues Club**
12. At the roundabout take the 1st exit and drive until you reach us 600m

3. GOOD TO KNOW IN ADVANCE

3.1 Visa

Please consult with your federation for information regarding visas for your country.

3.2 Identity card

You need to have a current identity card and it is recommended to carry a passport.

3.3 Health requirements

It is not necessary to have a special vaccination before you travel to Australia.
It is recommended to travel with international travel insurance.

3.4 Local currency

The Australian currency is Aus Dollar.

Currency rate (Jan 6th):

1 Aus Dollar = US \$ 0.998522

1 Aus Dollar = GBP 0.624409

1 Aus Dollar = Euro 0.738333

Credit cards are widely accepted in Hotels, Restaurants, Gas Stations etc. This is for established credit cards like American Express, MasterCard or VISA.

3.5 Time change

Sydney Australia is on EDT. EDT is 11 hours ahead of Coordinated Universal Time (UTC)

Note that EDT is a [daylight saving time/summer time](#) zone. It is generally only used during the summer in Sydney / New South Wales, during the winter [EST](#) is used instead.

Sydney will stay on EDT until Sunday, April 3, 2011 at 3:00 AM when it will turn clocks to EST (EST = 1 hour back)

5.1 Nomination / registration

RIDERS MUST REGISTER ONLINE BEFORE MONDAY APRIL 25TH. IF YOU DO NOT REGISTER ON OR BEFORE THIS DATE THERE IS A LATE FEE OF \$20.00.

5.2 Conditions

The Cable Wakeboard World Council - Tour Stop in Penrith will be carried out according to the IWWF Cable Wakeboard World Council rules 2011.

5.3 Safety

Please note that you have to wear a helmet and an approved life vest.

Vest must be approved as per your country/regions official standards.

All participants ride at their own risk. For all safety rules please refer to the World Rules at www.cablewakeboard.net (via Council zone – Documents).

5.4 Categories Wakeboard

A rider's age as of 1st January 2011 of the current year will be used to determine the age bracket.

Mini Boys & Mini Girls: 2000 or later (Under 12)

Boys & Girls: 1996 or later (Under 16)

Junior Men & Junior Ladies: 1992 or later (Under 20)

Open Men & Open Ladies: No age restriction

Masters Men & Masters Ladies: 1978 or before (Over 30)

Veterans Men & Veterans Ladies: 1968 or before (Over 40)

To clarify: a rider born in 2000 can compete in Minis, Boys, Junior or Open categories, or a rider born in 1992 can compete in Juniors or Open, same for Master and Veterans – a rider born in 1968 can choose to compete in Veterans, Masters or Open.

Double starts at one competition are not allowed. Starting in one wakeboard and one wakeskate category at one competition is not considered as double start.

There will be a minimum of 6 riders required to open a category, with the exception of Mini Boys, Mini Girls, Girls and Junior Ladies, where 4 riders will be the minimum.

5.5 Categories Wakeskate

A rider's age as of 1st January 2011 of the current year will be used to determine the age bracket.

Junior Men & Junior Ladies: 1992 or later (Under 20)

Open Men & Open Ladies: No age restriction

Double starts at one competition are not allowed. Starting in one wakeboard and one wakeskate category at one competition is not considered as double start.

There will be a minimum of 6 riders required to open a category, with the exception of Junior Ladies, and Open Ladies where 4 riders will be the minimum.

5.6 License / IWWF Membership

All riders should be current members of their respective country's **IWWF affiliated Federation**.

In addition, entrants from EAME should have the EAME International Wakeboard License (National Federations register their riders license online).

5.7 Entry Fee Wakeboard and Wakeskate

Entry Fee is \$80.00 per competitor.

Entry Fee for double start (1x wakeboard & 1x wakeskate event) is additional \$35.00.

You will receive Lunch and dinner on Saturday the 30th of April.

Drinks are not included but can be bought at the cable.

All competitors will receive the special riding rate of \$29.00 per day at the park. You must have registered and paid for the competition to qualify for this special price.

Payment must be made onsite via credit card, eftpos or cash.

You have to pay the Entry Fee and complete all required registration paperwork no later than Friday the 29th of April at 12 midday.

5.8 Riders Registration and Paperwork - Onsite

All riders will need to register on Thursday the 28th from 4-7pm and Friday morning the 29th of April before official training starts at 12 midday.

Don't forget to bring along your passport or ID as well as a copy of your license.

The Riders Registration will take place at Cables Wake Park Penrith.

Further information will be announced in Bulletin 2.

5.9 Doping control

In accordance with the IWWF Anti-Doping Rules, drug controls may be conducted during this competition. Upon entering this competition all riders agree to be subject to doping control. 5.10 Official practice day

Your official practice time will be 12-2pm on 29th of April 2011. Trainings will be allocated per age division. There will be 4 x half hour practice sessions.
