1. Location

Belgrade is a capital of Serbia. Cable: 2002 Rixen Masts: 5 Height: 9 m Length: 760 m

Obstacles

An exact Obstacle plan will be announced in the second Bulletin! Fixed Obstacles in the lake: Right Slider, Right Kicker, Left Kicker, Table Top

2. Before traveling to Serbia

2.1. Visa

Make your visa application in person and one month before you proceed to Serbia to avoid any inconvenience.

We point out that you will get binding information at your appropriate travel agencies or consulate. Please note that nearly every country has got different visa requirements.

2.2 Identity card

Before traveling to Serbia you need to have a current identity card. It is recommended to bring a passport (not ID-card) along. Please confer with your federation to assure yourself.

2.3. Further entry requirements

Advice for traveling by car:

It is a law to own a third party liability insurance. Further you need a passport when you enter Serbia by car.

Please stick to the rule that you are not allowed to consume alcohol before you drive by car.

Speed limits:

Within built-up area: 50 km/h Country road: 80 km/h Motorway: 120 km/h

Helpful translations of traffic signs:

Radovi na putu = road works Bolnica = hospital

Centar = centre Pivo=beer



Health:

It is recommended to own an international travel insurance.

Water:

Tap water is clean but it contains many minerals; many foreign people have got a health intolerance against it. It is recommended to drink regular mineral water (bottles).

2.4. Local currency

Please note that you have to change money. The Serbian currency is Dinar (RSD). For example: 1 Euro = 101 Dinars (exchange rate from 12-Jul-2011) You are able to pay by credit card. Established credit cards (like Visa, Master, American Express) are accepted. You can draw cash at ATMs by using your EC card or credit card.

2.5 Time difference

Please note that Belgrade is on Central European Time (CET) For example: it is 00:00 in Central Europe – it is 00:00 in Belgrade and 23:00 in London

2.6 General information

Mains electricity: 220 volt Use an Euro plug or an universal adapter. Emergency telephone numbers: Fire department call 93 Police call 92 Ambulance call 94 International prefix for Serbia is +381

Serbian network is connected to the European GSM standards. By using your national mobile phone you will be connected with following networks: Telenor, Telekom, VIP

3. How to get to Belgrade

By plane:

International flights will enter Serbia in Belgrade at Tesla International Airport

We will place an information counter for your disposal where the shuttle will start.

Airport-Hotel-Airport transport

An organized transport will be provided from the airport to the official hotel. Price for both ways (Airport - Hotel & Hotel - Airport) will be 20 Euros per person paid directly to the driver. Please note that you may have waiting times as we organize the transport to catch as many people as possible.

4. Accommodation

The official Hotel is Hotel Serbia. It's a good hotel that provides us with special prices. Camping at the lake is possible.

30 EUR per person per day sharing in double room with breakfast, plus stay tax 1.3 EUR per person per day normal price is 35 EUR + 1.3 EUR Stay tax

When making hotel reservations, please indicate that you come for the Wakeboard Competition.

5. "Nice to have" for the riders

- Organized Transport from hotel to cable and back at predefined times.

• You would be able to buy friends-passes for your parents or accompanists during your registration at location for 60 Euros. These cover the meals and access to rider's area for 3 days.

E&A Championships:

Juniors/Boys/Girls 100 Euro Open, Masters & Veterans 140 Euro The entry fee must be paid cash latest when you register at the competition venue.

6.1 Nomination & Entry

E&A Championships

All riders should be members of their respective country's IWWF affiliated Federation. In addition, entrants from E&A should have the E&A International Wakeboard License (National Federations register their riders license online).



How it works:

The International Waterski and Wakeboard Federation (IWWF) is founded in 1946. The IWWF is recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) as official partner since 1967. Wakeboarding is part of the World Games (Non Olympic Games patronized by IOC) since 2005. Since 2011 Wakeboard is on the Shortlist for the Olympic Games 2020! The IWWF has more than 90 Member Nations all over the World and is organizing the Nationals Championships together with this Federations all over the globe. IWWF is also organizing together with the Agencys and local Federations the IWWF World Championships, the IWWF World Cup, the IWWF World Trophy and hundreds of internationals Competitions all over the World. With worldwide more than 90 affiliate countries, hundreds of clubs and thousands of members the IWWF is the global leader in the sport of waterski and wakeboarding. The IWWF and its Cable Wakeboard World Council (CWWC) is a rider formed voluntary nonprofit working council and is organizing and promoting the wakeboard sport on a worldwide level. It is the leading group for organizing competitions, developing the Cable Wakeboard World Rules, formats, judging criteria's, educating Judges and helping organizers to running the competitions. The CWWC is specialist in running the sport Parts of Events under fair conditions for all riders, fair and fast judging, perfect just in time timetables, live and online results and TV Production Results Interfaces for Live Streaming or Live TV Productions. Exceptions: Riders from countries that don't have a Wakeboard/Waterski Federation affiliated to IWWF are allowed to register for the Championships themselves. Please contact us and we will help you to arrange the insurance policy and permission for individual entry.

The Entry Forms will be attached to the this bulletin and are also available for download from the official website.

In addition to your official nomination and entry you need to enter the competition at <u>www.cablewakeboard.net</u>.

All riders should be members of their respective country's IWWF affiliated Federation with a valid international wakeboard license.

11. Doping control

In accordance with the IWWF Anti-Doping Policy, random drug testing will be conducted on any of the competition days. All riders must have their passports with them at all times during the competition. Please note, if you are randomly chosen for drug testing, and fail to identify yourself with your passport, or fail to take the test for any other reason, it will result with an immediate disqualification. IWWF complies with WADA Anti-Doping Policy. Please visit www.wada-ama.org for more information on prohibited substances and TUE.
