
## Dear Riders & Federations

It's a pleasure for us to invite you to the 2012 edition of the **Europe-Africa Championships Cable Wakeboard & Wakeskate**, to be held from 4<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> September 2012 in Toulouse, France.

## 1. Location Map

TNS is the Télési Nautique de Sesquières (near Toulouse), in the South West of France. Built in 1992, it turns clockwise and runs 727.5m long. There are 4 pylons, with the main cable at 8.5m high. The tow lines are 17m long.



### Description of the obstacles (Length x Width x Maximum height in meter)

- 1&2: Curved Kickers: 4 x 2 x 1.1
- 3. Straight Kicker: 3 x 1x 1
- 4. "Dragon" Slider: 13 x 0.5 x 0.8
- 5. Flat Bar: 25 x 0.3 x 0.4
- 6. Roof: 13 x 0.5 x 1.2
- 7. A Frame: 18 x 0.5 x 1.5

## 2. Before travelling to France

---

### 2.1 Visa

France is part of the Schengen Area so most of the European travellers don't need a visa for short stays. ### 2.2 Identity proof

Please make sure that you are coming with a valid ID document stating date of birth and nationality. **It is recommended to competitors to bring a passport (not ID-card) along all the time at the Cable because of possible Doping Controls!**

### 2.3 Local currency

The French currency is Euro (€).

Established credit cards (like Visa, Master, American Express) are accepted in most places. You can also use them to draw cash at ATMs.

### 2.4 Time difference

Toulouse is on Central European Time (CET)

For example, 00:00 in Central Europe is 00:00 in Toulouse and 23:00 in London

### 2.5 General information

Main electricity: 220 Volt, use a Euro plug or an universal adapter.

### 3. How to get to Toulouse

---

#### **By plane:**

Many international flights (including Easyjet) land in Toulouse Blagnac airport (TLS).



#### **Airport-Hotel-Airport transport:**

On September 3, 4 and 9<sup>th</sup>, an organized transport will be provided between the airport and the hotels for 5€ per person each way.

Volunteers will welcome you at the Toulouse airport where the shuttle will start. Please note that you may have waiting times as we organize the transport to catch as many people as possible (~every 30 minutes).

**Public transportation:** bus lines 15 and 110 go to the cable every 30 minutes. More information from the tourism office will available on site.

#### **Advice to travel by car, speed limits:**

Within built-up area: 50 km/h

Country road: 90 km/h

Motorway: 130 km/h (beware of the toll cost!)

## 5. Entry

---

E&A Championships entry fees are :

- Juniors/Boys/Girls: **120 Euro**
- Open, Masters & Veterans: **160 Euro**

Please note the raise of entry fees of 20 EUR compared to the 1<sup>st</sup> bulletin information. The reason for the raise is there was no other way to cover the Officials' travel costs. We apologize to the teams for the late notice. Federations sending officials to EC and who intended to cover their travel expenses are advised to contact ECWC in order to reimburse the money.

The entry fees must be paid at the latest when you register at the competition venue.

Riders starting in both wakeboard and wakeskate categories will pay additional entry fees for the second category of 50 Euro for Open and older, and 30 Euro for Juniors and younger.

The competition site will be CLOSED from 9pm to 7am and its access forbidden and patrolled with canine security teams.

Registration starts Monday at 10 am - 12 + 2pm - 7pm at the cable on Monday (except for the riders coming from World Cup in Tokyo). Preferably by the team captains.

Liability forms has to be signed! Parents from under Age kids can download in advance from the Competition Homepage!

Entry fees include:

- Free lunches with drinks from Wednesday - Saturday (To book breakfast at your hotel is up to you, please decide at check in, there is no free breakfast provided for free at the cable!)
- Special riders area
- Competitors' Boards supervision

Friends and Team Support passes will be available on site for 60€. Friends pass will NOT include the shuttle to the opening ceremony which will be held Place du Capitole at 18h30, reception 'salle des illustres'. The easiest to park for the ceremony is to use the parking "esquirol".

Exceptions: Riders from countries that don't have a Wakeboard/Waterski Federation affiliated to IWWF are allowed to register for the Championships themselves. Please contact us and we will help you to arrange the insurance policy and permission for individual entry.

## **How it works ?**

The International Waterski and Wakeboard Federation (IWWF) was founded in 1946. IWWF is recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) as official partner since 1967. Wakeboarding is part of the World Games (Non Olympic Games patronized by IOC) since 2005. Since 2011 Wakeboard is on the Shortlist for addition to the Olympic Games 2020!

The IWWF is the world leader in waterskiing and wakeboarding with more than 90 member nations, hundreds of clubs and thousands of members. Together with agencies and local federations, the IWWF organizes Nationals Championships, European and World Championships, the IWWF World Cup and World Trophy, and hundreds of internationals competitions all over the world.

The IWWF Cable Wakeboard World Council (CWWC) is a rider formed, voluntary non-profit working council. CWWC organizes and promotes wakeboard, helping organizers to create and run competitions, developing the Cable Wakeboard World Rules, formats, judging criteria's and educating judges. The CWWC is recognised for running the sport part of events under fair conditions for all riders, fair and fast judging, perfect "just in time" timetables, live & online results, and results interfaces for live streaming or live TV Productions. - Boys & Girls: born in 1997 or later
- Junior Men & Junior Ladies: born in 1993 or later
- Open Men & Open Ladies: no age restriction
- Masters Men & Ladies : born in 1981 or before
- Veterans Men & Ladies: born in 1971 or before

To protect young children, participants will have to be born in 2000 or earlier.

For the first time, it was decided to open a 'seated' category for handicapped riders. It will be run as a Trophy with no team scores. See addendum to this bulletin.

**A deposit of 30€ in cash will be asked during registration for the bibs.**

## 9. License

---

All riders should be members of their respective country's IWWF affiliated Federation with a valid international wakeboard license (obtained by online registration of the rider's licenses by their National Federations).

## 10. Doping control

---

In accordance with the IWWF Anti-Doping Policy, random drug testing will be conducted on any of the competition days. All riders must have their passports with them at any time during the competition. Please note, if you are randomly chosen for drug testing, and fail to identify yourself with your passport, or fail to take the test for any other reason, it will result with an immediate disqualification. IWWF complies with WADA Anti-Doping Policy. Please visit [www.wada-ama.org](http://www.wada-ama.org) for more information on prohibited substances and TUE.

Riders must carry their Passport at all time during the competition for the doping control.

## **ADDENDUM DISABLED CABLE WAKEBOARD**

### **1. EUROPE & AFRICA TROPHY**

#### **1.1 GENERAL**

- 1.1.1 The format and rules of the Disabled Europe & Africa Cable Wakeboard Trophy shall follow that of the E&A Cable Wakeboard Championships except where otherwise stated below.

#### **1.2 NAME**

The Europe & Africa Cable Wakeboard Trophy may be named the European Cable Wakeboard Trophy.

#### **1.3 ELIGIBILITY**

Eligible for this competition are Men and Women of the following disabled categories:

- Multiple plegics and double leg amputees:
  - Category MP1
  - Category MP2
  - Category MP3
- Leg amputees
  - Category L

Any rider holding a current World or Europe & Africa classification card will ski in the category on that card.

Any rider not holding a current World or Europe & Africa classification card may ski in the Cable Wakeboard Trophy as follows:

- Skiers claiming MP classification will ski as MP3
- Skiers claiming L classification will ski as classified by the Chief Judge

All disabled riders will compete in only one Disabled Division – Seated Wakeboard. All disabled categories have to ride seated, and in-line with the board, on contrary to standing riders who ride in wakeboard style.

Disabled riders are entitled for a push for the start, at their own choice.

#### **1.4 AGE CATEGORY**

There is no age category for the disabled event; every rider is in the Open category.

#### **1.5 COMPETITION ENTRY**

Each Federation may enter a maximum of 8 riders, regardless of their disabled category or sex.

#### **1.6 MINIMA FOR ENTERING**

There will be no minimum entry requirement.

## 1.7 ROUNDS

As the Disabled riders are currently not ranked in cable wakeboard, their specific heat and running order will be determined randomly. The Chief Judge and Chief Scorer will check and adjust the start lists to ensure the heats are fair and balanced, putting lower figure of their category first (i.e. MP1 run before MP2, MP2 before MP3, MP3 before AB), considering level of riding, nationalities, or any other reasons

## 1.8 OBSTACLES

8.2 alter for disabled riders who are not entitled to attempt an obstacle, which needs an ollie to access it.

## 1.9 CALCULATION OF SCORES

Each rider's performance is scored by the competition jury by the cable wakeboard rules. This score is altered (multiplied) with the rider's category ratio to give his/her final score.

<b>Category</b>	<b>Ratio</b>
L or AB	1.0
MP1	2.0
MP2	1.6
MP3	1.2

An Able Bodied (AB) rider willing to compete seated has to join the L category and has to ride seated.

MP1: Athletes unable to utilize the majority of their trunk musculature. Athlete is unable to rise from knees without arm support. They lack full use of their upper extremities. Typically, they do not have adequate grip strength and may utilize their forearms or wrists to hold the handle.

MP2: Athletes able to use their upper trunk muscles to partially raise their upper body from their knees in the skiing position. Typically, they have full use of their upper extremities.

MP3: Athletes with good use of the majority of their trunk muscles. Athlete may be able to use partial abdominal musculature. Typically, they are able to raise the trunk from their knees in the skiing position and have full use of their upper extremities.

Qualification criteria: only 20% of able bodied are allowed in the seated category.
