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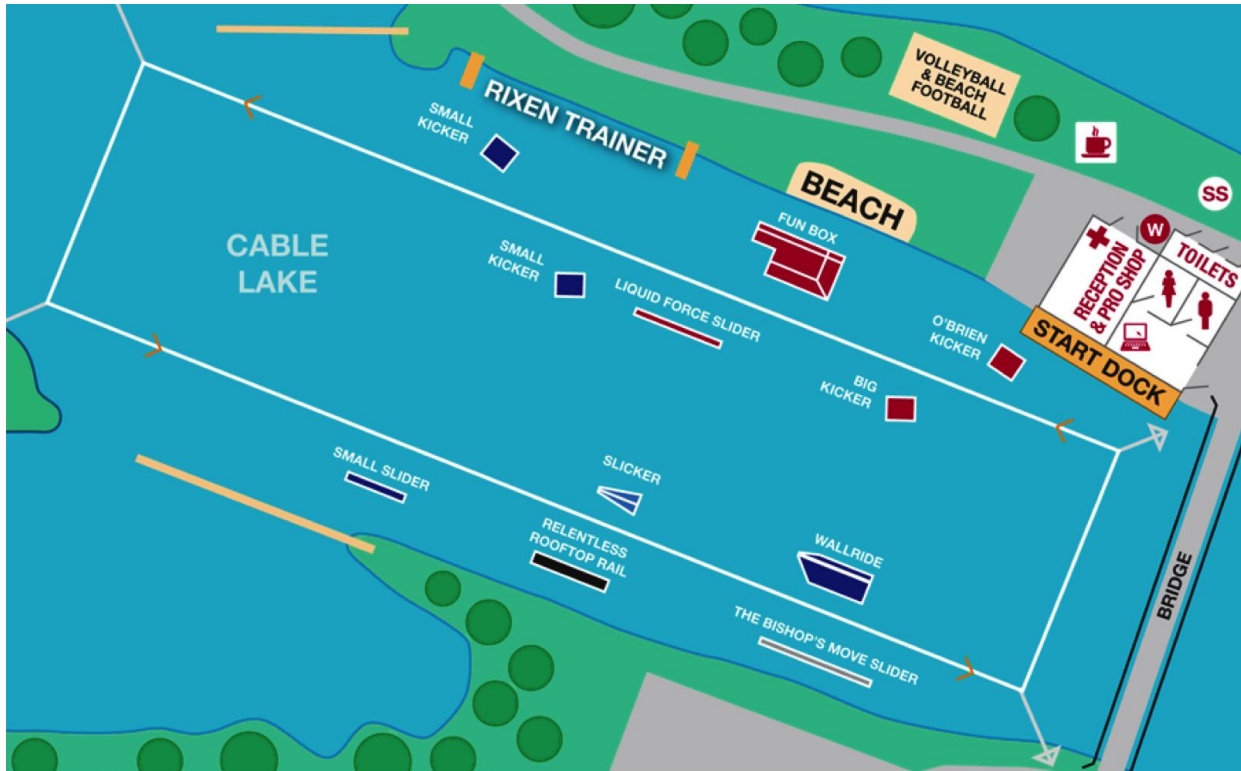

<p>Small Slider: The “Goodwood” slider, otherwise known as the small flat bar. It has just undergone a complete refit for new surface and side panels and was also lengthened by 2m and raised on new floats to sit a few inches higher at the same time. It now measures 13m long, 40cm wide on the riding surface and sits 47cm above the water. Rebuilt by Tom Clark, Sam Cordery and Matt Stevens.</p>	
<p>Relentless Rooftop Rail: Built in 2008 by Ben Cordery, Matt Stevens, Tom Szubuski, and Seb Thursby. It measures 17m long on the waterline, 2m high at the peak and 60cm wide on the surface making it the widest rail in the park. 9m to point, 8m from point to end. 90cm drop off the end.</p>	<p>Slicker: Originally the up-rail from the beetle slider which was closed in 2008, we kept this part as a simple wedge rail after widening the base a little to help it stay upright. It was rebuilt at the end of the 2010 season by Ben Cordery, Matt Stevens and Tom Clark. During this rebuild it was changed from double pipe to 38cm wide flat bar, and the angle was mellowed dropping the height to 1m22 from 1m60. It is 3.5m long on the waterline.</p>
<p>The Bishop’s Move Slider: also known as the O’shea, the Sprite, the Mark Warner and the Sunsail. It still has a few original parts from 2002 when it was built by Phil Perry, Corey Edwards,</p>	<p>Wallride: Originally designed by Dan Back in 2001 and built the same year by Illona Oshea’s brother. Extended and changed from pipe rail to flat bar in 2004 by Phil Perry and Spiros Savanis and further</p>



<p>Bruce Todd and Craig Fraser, although it was almost completely rebuilt in 2008 by Matt Stevens, Tom Szubuski and Phil Perry. It measures 18m06 long on the waterline, 1m60 high and is double pipe width.</p>	<p>extended in 2006 again by Phil and Spiros. It underwent its most major rebuild in the winter of 2009/10 at the hands of Tom Clark and Matt Stevens, re-surfacing the top rail and adding a 2m40 wide wall-ride along the right hand side. It now measures 13m20 long, 80cm high and has a 17cm wide flat bar along the top of the wall-ride.</p>
<p>O'Brien Kicker: The big outside kicker. Made in 2009 by Matt Stevens, Richard Nicholson, Tom Szubuski and Tom Clark. It measures 3m30 long on the waterline, 2m04 wide and 1m25 high.</p>	<p>Big inside kicker: Bought in 2007 from Germany for the fat face big air competition, won that year by CK, we gave it more transition for the event and have kept it the same since. It measures 3m60 long on the waterline, 2m04 wide and 1m35 high making it the biggest kicker in the park.</p>
<p>Fun Box: Also known as the iceberg. Designed by Matt Stevens and Richard Nicholson, built in the winter of 2010/11 by Matt Stevens, Richard Nicholson, Tom Clark, Seb Thursby, Nigel Offord, Nathan Gaskin and Ali Poulter. By far the biggest obstacle in the lake it measures and weighs an impressive 7 tonnes. Fitted with water spray jets to keep the vast area of plastic wet.</p>	<p>Liquid Force Slider: Built in the winter of 2005/6 by Phil Perry and Oli Jarlett, it underwent a major rebuild in early 2010 to remove the whole section before the A-frame, make it wider, safer and more stable, done by Tom Clark, Matt Stevens, and Seb Thursby. It measures 17m30 along the waterline with a 7.5m up-rail, 4m20 flat on the top and a 6.5m down rail. The surface is 38cm wide.</p>
<p>Small outside kicker: Built by Phil Perry and Spiros Savanis in 2005 it was refitted in 2009 by Matt Stevens, Tom Clark and Tom Szubuski for new surfaces and sides. It measures 2m25 long on the waterline, 2m04 wide and stands at 75cm high.</p>	<p>Small inside kicker: Built in late 2010 by Matt Stevens, Richard Nicholson and Tom Clark it measures 2m25 long on the waterline, 2m04 wide and 80cm high. Unofficially called the mamma tongue. Don't ask why.</p>
