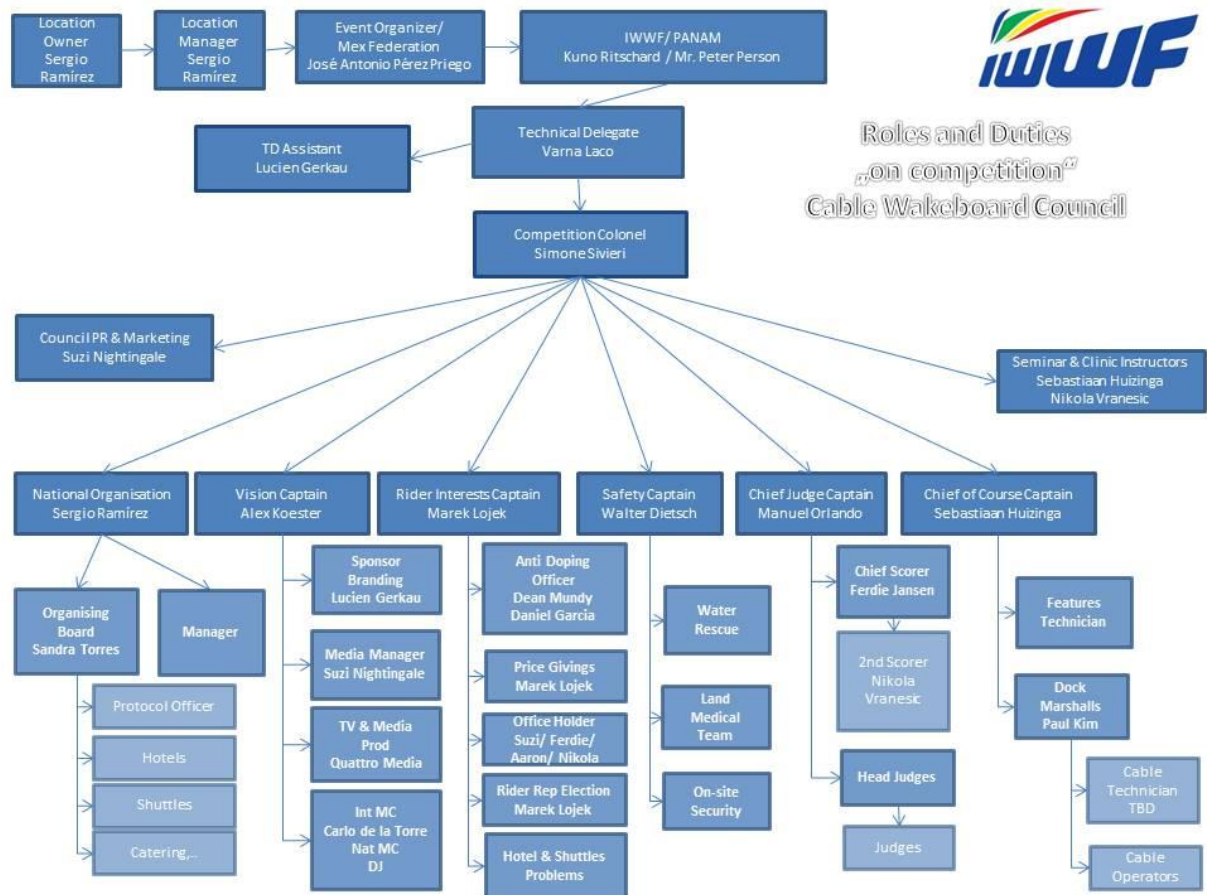

4 HOW TO GET TO ACUASKI

4.1 By air

Nearest airport is:
 Mexico City International (MEX)
 Probably new airport in Cuernavaca could also become an option.

4.2 By car

From Mexico City:
 Take the Autopista del Sol (Mexico-Acapulco). Crossing Cuernavaca and continue on the same highway. Exit right at the Alpuyeca-Jojutla Toll Plaza and continue towards Xoxocotla. When you reach the "Y" (security module and OXXO convenience store)



dividing the road, take the right path (to Tequesquitengo). About half a mile down, there is a long wall and at the end that says "Acuaski".

4.3 Official Airport Shuttles/ By bus:

We have 3 options for the shuttles

a. Bus airport - hotel in tequesquitengo US\$ 15

This option needs a special organization and we will have a person on the airport. To offer this service is important to us to have the flights informatios and the confirmation that you need the service at the latest on October 1 to arrange special departures time. In this service the capacity is 35 passangers so maybe some of you could reach the others passengers for a few minutes. Finally consider a tax paid by having buses within the airport so we ask for your cooperation

b. Van airport - hotel in tequesquitengo US\$ 18

This service is similar to the bus but this is in a Mercedes Benz Van with capacity just for 15 passengers. In this case also we need the flight information and the confirmation of the service at the latest on October 1 to arrange special departures time

c. Bus to cuernavaca – Cuernavaca to tequesquitengo US\$ 20

This is usig the regular services of Pullman de Morelos. It

If you don't want a special service or you have a delay in your flights you could take the ordinary service with pullman de morelos (see bellow the departures times) and then we could offer a service to bring you to the la selva station to hotel in tequesquitengo

5 GOOD TO KNOW IN ADVANCE

5.1 Visa

Some foreign citizens need a visa to visit Mexico. You should check the following link in order to know if you need a visa to enter Mexico

If so, the Mexican Waterski and Wakeboard Federation (FEMEW) can extend you an invitation letter for the Championships. Alternative, you can also obtain a letter from your own Federation where it states that you are a member of your country's national team.

It should be noted that the VISA must be obtained at the Embassy or Consulate of Mexico before you leave your country; we advise you to make the procedure with time.

5.2 Identity card/passport

For the ANTI DOPING Controls you need to have a **passport** valid for at least 6 months. An identity card is not enough.

All riders have to sign a liability form. For riders under 18 years old, their parents have to sign it as well. Team Captains must present all the liability forms to the IWWF Officials at registration.

1. **Bus Trip to Acapulco**

It is possible to take the Public Bus to do a day trip to the west coast of Mexico.

Catch the bus in the early morning and come back in the late evening or stay overnight.

2. **Jardines de México (*Gardens of Mexico*)**

Jardines de Mexico is a 51 hectares park with nine thematic gardens and a vast variety of multi-color flowers and trees. Explore the "Italian Garden" and travel to the the Renaissance; experience the peace of the "Japanese Garden"; live Mexico in the the "Garden of Cacti", which houses specimens from all over the country and in the "Tropical Garden" which reflects the biodiversity around us. At the 'Fan Flores' amaze your sight with shapes and colors, and at the "Four Springs" enjoy the flowers of the season.

3. **Xochicalco, in the house of Flowers:**

Morelos's main archaeological zone, the mystic World Heritage Site of Xochicalco, an ancient city lying between hills and mountains, which had its heyday between the VII and IX century AD. The city stunning beauty is generous in the art of its engraved walls, its immense ballgame, and its artificial caves where ancient observatories shelled the secret of heaven.

5. **Las Estacas (The Stakes)**

Las Estacas is an aquatic adventures natural park where flows the Yautepec River flows. It has a spring (el borbollón) from where 7 thousand liters of water per second flow to the river and is the heart of the park. The spring is about 10 thousand years old and has a width of about 12 meters. You can go camping, fishing, snorkeling, kayaking, diving and swimming in this amazing place..

At Tepoztlan, you must visit the Convento (convent), enjoy a exotic flavored sorbet at Tepoznieves and just walk around the town, having a quesadilla or tlacoyo for lunch at the local market.

7. Rafting

Get into the adventure in the canyon of the lower section of Rio Amacuzac, traveling more than 12 km down river with more than 20 rapids ranging from Class II Class III - IV, surrounded by jungle; 2 amazing hours of excitement that sail faster than the "Ta Canon", "The yaute", "The Raw Quita", "Donkeys Tomb" and many more to put an adrenaline rush.

You can also enjoy the stunning scenery of the canyon, vegetation and some of its native fauna.

8. Zip-lines:

A circuit of 8 stunning and exciting zip lines of different lengths and heights, with the shortest being 80 meters long.

9. Taxco

The most brilliant jewel of both the Baroque and the Churrigueresque in America, the Church of Santa Prisca is a symbol of Taxco.

Taxco has the Colonial Art Museum located in what is known as the Humboldt House, where you'll find works of religious art, luxury goods and more of everyday life at the time. Taxco is world famous for its silver crafts that you can find the local market and boutiques all around the city.

Cacahuamilpa is one of the largest cave systems in the world, with stalactites and stalagmites forming amazing forms where local recognize historical characters and more contemporaneous celebrities. In these caverns prehispanic inhabitants held their ceremonies and worship to the. A true wonder of nature, these caves are a must. The tour of the caves takes about 2 hours.

8 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

8.1 Nomination

It is the sole responsibility of IWWF-affiliated National Federations to select and enter their riders.

Please have the new Entry Requirements in mind: CWWC Rulebook §3.2

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS AS OF YEAR 2016: For Junior, Open and Masters 800 points, and for Boys, Girls and Veterans 400 points on the current CWWC Ranking list at the time when the competition starts. Additionally, each Federation can enter max. 2 riders per gender per category with no minimum requirements.

Please have in mind that a rider can add points from different categories to get the minimum requirement together. i.E.: a boy could compete in 4 STAR Events in Junior Categories and at his nationals in Boy Category. He can add the achieved points and when he has minimum 400 he can start in boys category or when he have more than 800 he could start in juniors. Same with Masters and Veterans points. Points from Wakeboard and Wakeskate could not be added.

8.2 Conditions

The Cable Wakeboard and Wakeskate World Championships will be carried out according to the IWWF Cable Wakeboard World Council rules.

8.3 Safety

Please note that all riders have to wear helmet and an approved life vest. All participants ride/compete at their own risk.

8.4 Categories Wakeboard and Wakeskate 2016

Wakeboard

U15/Boys and Girls	Your year of birth must be 2001 or later.
U19/ Junior Men/Ladies	Your year of birth must be 1997 or later.
Open Men/Ladies	No age restriction.
+30/Masters Men/Ladies	Your year of birth must be 1985 or before.
+40/Veterans Men/Ladies	Your year of birth must be 1975 or before

Wakeskate

U19/ Junior Men/Ladies	Your year of birth must be 1997 or later.
Open Men/Ladies	No age restriction

Only riders born in 2005 (Last year Minis) or before can take part at International Titled events (Confederation or World Championships).





8.5 License

All riders must be members of their respective country’s IWWF affiliated federation. All entrants must have the IWWF International Wakeboard Licence.

How it works:

IWWF has a network of +90 national federations. Only IWWF-affiliated national federations can submit entry forms for the World Championships. By entering riders for the World Championships, national federations certify that their respective riders are in possession of a wakeboard licence and a valid insurance (which provides international coverage)

Each national federation selects its team and decides on allowing the individual entries. If you are not sure how it works in your country or how to locate your respective National Federation, please contact us and we will provide information to you.

Exceptions: Riders from countries without a national wakeboard/wakeski federation affiliated to the IWWF, will be permitted to register to compete in the IWWF World Championships, subject to approval from the IWWF. Please contact us for more information.

8.6 Entry fee Wakeboard and Wakeskate

Category Championships Juniors, Boys, Girls	140 Euro or 160 USD
Open (Open, Seated) Championships & Masters, Veterans	180 Euro or 200 USD

Riders starting in wakeboard and wakeskate category will pay an additional entry fee for the second category of € 50 for Open and older and € 30 for U19 and Younger.

Riders from the first part of the competition (Category Junior, Boys, Girls, Masters, Veterans) are allowed to start in the second part of the competition when fulfilling the qualification criteria for Open Men or Open Ladies.

Therefore they have to pay the second Entry Fee for the second part.

Riders who want to stay as spectators can buy the friends pass for the second part.

Family & Friends package include lunch at site for 5 days The fee includes water and soft drinks.

Friends Package 1: Category Championships: 4th - 8th November US\$ 50

Friends Package 2: Open Championships: 8th - 12th November US\$ 50

Friends Package 1+2: Category and Open Championships: 4th – 12th November US\$ 90

For Family and Friends who booked the Official Hotel, breakfast and dinner are included in the hotel price.

1. Completed all **profile fields** (to check please click on the rider link on the entry form)
2. A **profile picture** in the first slot. (first picture will be displayed on the Monitors)

Once all your riders have completed the above steps the team Captain should report to registration with all passports, forms and proof of payment to complete registration.

Currencies accepted at registration are MXN, Euros & US Dollars!

8.8 RIDERS' REPRESENTATIVE ELECTION

- Rider Rep Nominations --: For World Rider Rep and all Confederation Rider Reps from AO, PANAM, E&A

This is the second time for the Cable Wakeboard World Council to officially elect the Rides' representative.

The mission of the riders' representative is to represent the views of the riders and make their voice heard within the Wakeboard Council. This rider sits also in the IWWF Athletes Commission where all diciplines are combinedd. Two Members of this Commission are sitting also as representatives on the IWWF Executive Board to decide everything in IWWF.

The term of the riders' representative is until the next World Champs in two years.

Procedure

The election of the riders' representative will take place during the riders meeting. Only the riders competing at these World Championships and present at the riders meeting have the right to vote.

Any rider wishing to stand for the position will nominate him/herself latest at the time of registration on site.

The nominees must:

- be over the age of 18
- should have competed in the Open finals of at least two titled events in the past 4 years
- be present at the World Champs at the time of registrations and the riders meeting, but not necessarily as a competitor

After the registrations are closed, the complete list of nominees will be published on info boards at the cable, in the official hotel and at cablewakeboard.net.





The ballot paper will be handed out to all riders participating at the Championships and the riders meeting and must be submitted by the end of the riders' meeting to the ballot box.

The results will be announced at the Opening Ceremony.

If you wish to stand for the election, don't wait until deadline! Submit your nomination now to CWWC at cwwc@cablewakeboard.net, as soon as we confirm your eligibility, you can start your campaign :)

Rental hours for teams 3 Days before the competition (1st to 3rd November)

Federations can book rental hours for teams online for the three days before: 1st, 2nd and 3rd of November from 8 to 12 and 14.00 to 18.00 hours. 30min are 100 Euro.

Price to ride inbetween per two hour is: US\$ 20,-

For rental hours we will follow these rules:

- Each country has 6 credits to book 6 different time frames.
- Each time frame is 30 minutes and has no limit of entries.
- You can use all 6 credits on the first day, but only 4 on the second and 2 on the last.
- The deadline for booking is 13 hours before the first time frame of the next day start.
- Bookings can be only made by the Team Captain with Federations Rights. With Federation Rights it is possible to enter in the «My Zone» a section to book the hours.
- You can only book with your full team of entered riders of Open and Category Championships because there are no rental hours between Open and Category Championships.
- We kindly ask you to make the payment at the registration on site for your number of riders and time used.

Official team training (4th and 8th November)

PART I: Boys, Girls, Junior, Masters, Verterans: 4th November

PART II: Open, Seated: 8th November

As always, each country will have the training times calculated by number of riders. The final schedule by country will be published in the evening after the registrations are done.

Training on the official practice day is included in the entry fees.





8.10 Doping control

According to with the IWWF anti-Doping Rules, Doping controls will be conducted during the competition. By entering this competition, all athletes agree to be subject to doping control.

Information about the IWWF Anti-Doping program, the current IWWF AD Rules and links to the list of banned substances can be found on iwwfed.com by clicking the Anti-Doping Information link at the top of the menu on the left sidebar of the homepage.

Due to continuing concerns over contaminated meat in certain parts of the world, the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) has re-emphasized the need for athletes to exercise extreme caution with regards to eating meat when traveling to competitions in Mexico. It has been shown that Mexico has a serious problem with meat contaminated with the prohibited substance clenbuterol, and WADA’s message to athletes competing in these countries remains the same: eat only in restaurants and cafeterias that have been approved by the event organizer.

IWWF is currently working with the Mexican Federation to try to ensure that there is advice on where and where not to eat during the Championships. Eating no meat, or less meat is certainly a good idea.

Please have your Passports all the time with you or with the team captain.

9 ENTRY FORM DEADLINES

Intention to enter and official Entries can be made online from February on.

After the riders joined the competitions, the Federations have to approve until the **October 19th 2016**.

From this date on, Late Entry Fee is charged with 10 € per day/per rider who is not approved.

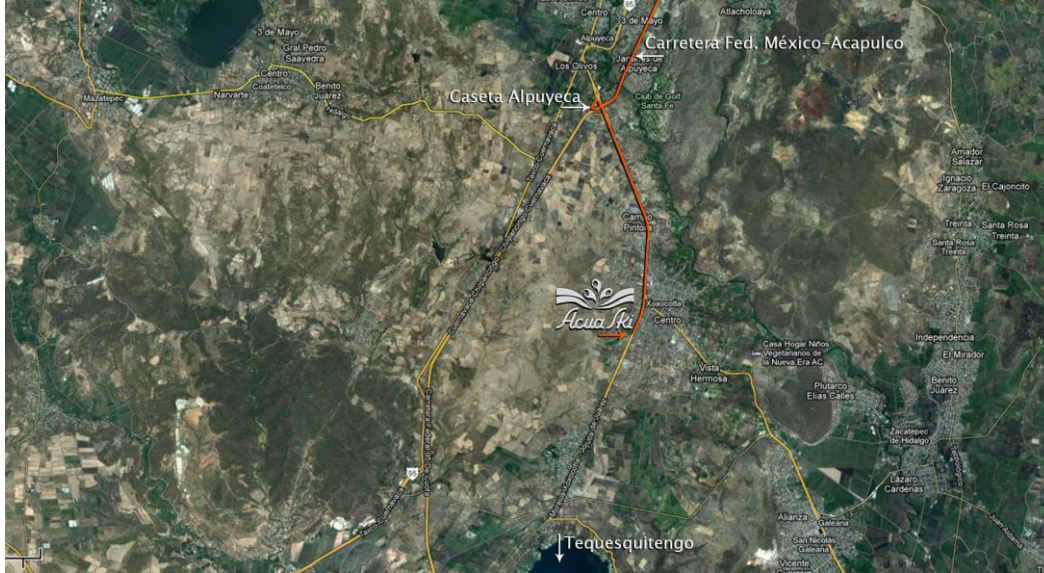
